Presentations will be made on the undercard of each race in the new Western Canadian Triple Crown, the undercard of the second leg of the Canadian Triple Crown, and on the undercard of the prestigious Canadian International (Gr. 1) and E. P. Taylor Stakes (Gr. 1), among others.

Celebrating our 50th anniversary allows us to honour and respect the legacy of our founding members while recognizing the impact that each region has on Thoroughbred racing in Canada. It is a way of thanking and supporting industry members nationwide, including those who have supported us for many years, and raising the profile of the Jockey Club of Canada and the contribution we make to Thoroughbred racing.

- October 8 at Woodbine Racetrack.
